These nests, which hang on the branches of thorny acacia trees or tall trees, are mesmerising to look at from afar. The weaver bird designs its nests with special skill to protect the chicks from heat, rain, enemy birds or snakes. Some nests are long and some are rather short. While swinging in the wind it seems as if a cradle is hand the sky. Often, the entire colony of swiftlet birds or weaver birds can be seen in a tree. These nests, tightly tied to the branches, remain safe even amid storms and rains. Seeing this art of nest building, the bird seems to be like an engineer of the aviation

These nests are usually built on trees like tamarind, lemon, karanja, banyan, khair etc, which are usually located on the banks of wells, streams, and drains. The male bird builds the nest and shows it to the female. If the female does not like it, he builds another nest. The male bird has a dark yellow body and black head, while the female is pale yellow in colour. The female lays about 4 to 5

The chicks of the sugar glider do not fly until they are fully strong. However, due to the increasing concrete jungle and rapid process of deforestation, the number of such nests is decreasing by leaps and bounds. Still, in many places in rural areas, such nests can still be seen perched on trees.
